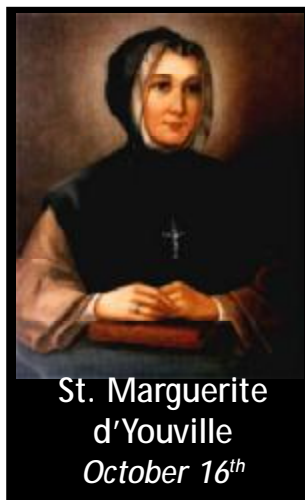
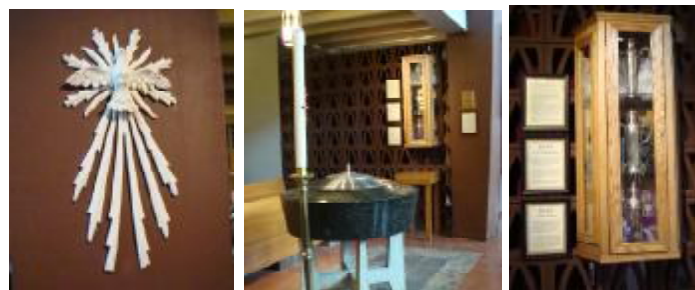

### MONTHLY MEN'S BREAKFAST GROUP

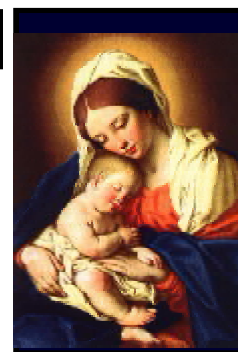
This new group will begin on:

# YOU WERE ASKING by Msgr. P. Stilla

Q. Whenever I try to pray at home or in Church, my mind wanders and I get terribly distracted. Why does this happen?

A. To properly answer your question during your prayer time, the disturbing argument you had that morning with your daughter repeatedly comes to mind, then it may not be a distraction at all but a prompting from God to set aside your book of prayers for now and



me what it is that you consider to be a distraction during prayer. I am convinced that what many of us invariably regard as distractions in prayer, may be just the opposite. For instance, if you are reciting your daily prayers as quickly as you can so that you can do something else that you find much more exciting as soon as possible, then your distraction is clearly a distraction. However, if



A. Why does my friend seem to get so much more out of prayer services that we both attend at our Church, than I do?

A. Contrary to popular opinion, when it comes to prayer, 'one size does not fit all'. It sounds like the *Form of Prayer* which is obviously most rewarding to your friend's spirituality (whatever the that form may be) is more suited to her than to you.



Which Form is best for me? Only you can answer this question because personality and temperament play a big part in prayer preferences and you alone know your personality best. If your prayer 'fits' you, it will feel right. Personality based Prayer Forms

◆ Some like well organized and formal prayers while others like prayers that are spontaneous and just feel good;

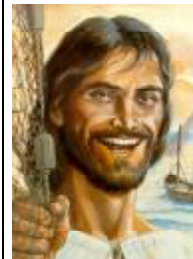
