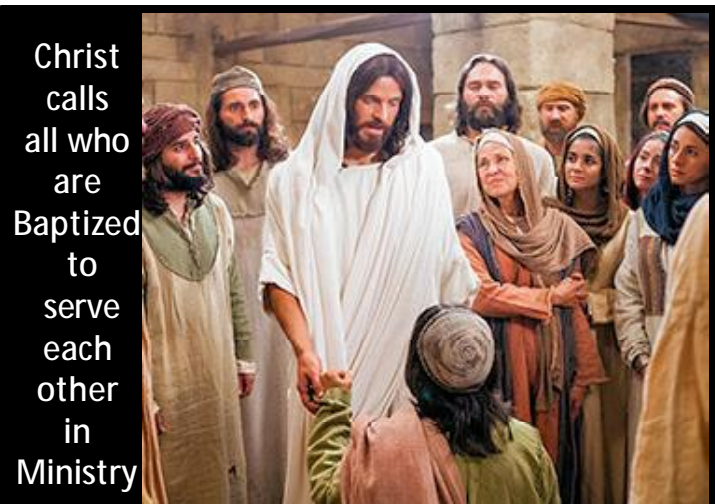
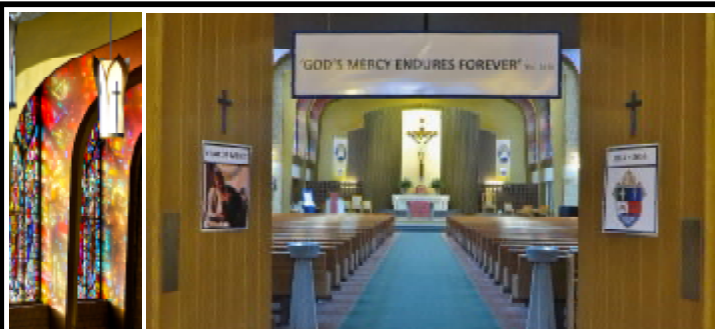

YOU WERE ASKING by Msgr. P. Stilla

Q. Why was the original Cathedral Baptistry converted into the current Memorial Chapel of the Pieta'?

A. One of the main reasons for the change was the fact that the original Baptistry had become too small to accommodate the family members during a Baptism. This had not been an issue when the original Baptistry was first designed for our Church, because prior to 1965, infants were baptized

individually and on different dates. Today Baptism Liturgies have become communal celebration of Faith with usually many infants being baptized during the same celebration.

Why the Change?

The reason for this change was to emphasize the communal aspect of

Christianity. After all, Baptism is the Sacrament which initiates us into the Church Community of Faith. Besides, the new location for the Baptismal Font at the front of the Cathedral

reminds us every Sunday, of the day of our own Baptism and the promises we made on that day.

Why a Chapel of the Pieta'?

After the Baptismal Font was relocated, the space was temporarily turned into a playroom for the children during Sunday Mass. It was eventually decided in 2005, that it would be more appropriate to move the children's room downstairs near the Auditorium and to use the former Baptistry as a Memorial Chapel for prayer, and remembrance

Michelangelo's Mary

A replica of the Pieta' was specifically chosen to adorn

our Memorial Chapel, so that its serene beauty might inspire us to reflect on the lives of the deceased members of our families and of our Cathedral Parish whose names

are recorded there in our four 'Books of Life'. The original sculpture in Rome measures 68 x 76 inches (174 x 195 cm.). Our replica which is a little smaller (48 x 46 in.), was purchased with the financial support of the Catholic Women's League of our Parish. Many

others also contributed to make our Chapel a beautiful fitting place for devotional prayer.

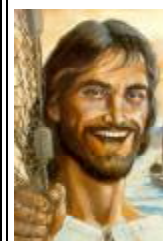
