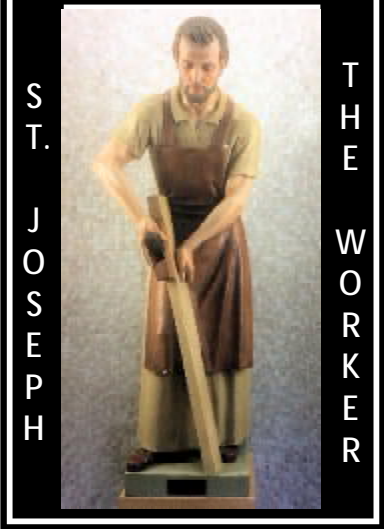


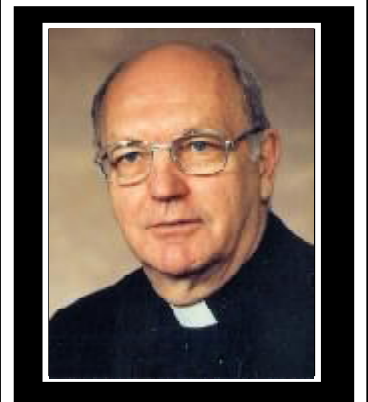

Msgr. Roy Carey , who served the Diocese his his Ordination in 1950, died on August 26th. He was born in Port Arthur and served as Pastor of the Parishes of: St. Hilary in Red Rock, and Corpus Christi and St. Margaret, both in Thunder Bay. Monsignor also served years ago as President of Catholic Missions in Canada from 1979 to 1984 and as Diocesan Vicar General form 1995 to 2005. After his retirement Msgr. Carey resided, for a short time, in our Cathedral Rectory

YOU WERE ASKING by Msgr. P. Stilla

This week, I am once again publishing a few popular misconceptions which I still encounter in some Catholic circles regarding Marriage and Divorce. I hope this column will help to dispel them. *Msgr. P. Stilla*

Misconception #1 The Church does not recognize any marriages that are performed by a Minister or by a Justice of the Peace.

Partially True. Our Church law obliges only Catholics to be married before a Catholic clergyman and 2 witnesses for their marriage to be recognized as valid by the Church. Except for the Orthodox, other Churches do not have this requirement for their own members. Consequently, the Catholic Church does accept as valid, the legal marriages of non-Catholics wherever they take place.

Misconception #2 Only Catholics who marry other Christians can be married in the Catholic Church.

Not True. To marry a Catholic in the Church, one is not required to be baptised or to convert to Catholicism because marriage is about a relationship and not about changing one's Faith.

Misconception #3 The Church accepts divorces granted to non-Catholics by Civil Law.

Not True. We believe that marriage is not simply a legal contract but also a Sacrament not only for Catholics but for all baptized Christians. Civil courts do not have the authority to take away one's Marriage Sacrament any more than

they can take away one's Baptism. Therefore we do not recognize civil divorces granted by the Courts.

Misconception #4 Those who divorce didn't try hard enough to make their marriage work.

Not True. Most couples who experience serious problems in their relationship usually try everything humanly possible to salvage their marriage but nothing they try ever seems to work.

Misconception #5 Annulment is just 'Catholic' divorce.

Definitely Not True. In a divorce, civil courts simply decree that a marriage is over. In an Annulment, a Church Tribunal proves that a marriage never actually ex-

isted since essential elements needed for a valid marriage were missing.

Misconception #6 Catholics who divorce are automatically excommunicat-

ed from the Catholic Church.

No Longer True. This was changed over 50 years ago. Divorce does not affect a Catholic's standing with the Church nor does it deny the Sacraments to him/her.

Misconception #7 Only if both are Catholics, is a couple allowed to have Mass at their Wedding.

No Longer True. This was changed years ago. It is now their choice.

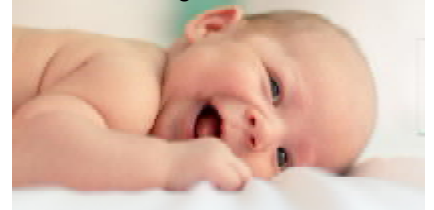
