

YOU WERE ASKING . . . by Msgr. P. Stilla

Q. Last week, you spoke about St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus. Most of the priests who serve in this Diocese are Diocesan Priests. Who is their founder?

A. You are right in saying that most of the priests who serve us here today are Diocesan Priests, even though our own Parish and others like it in the Diocese were first founded by priests who were affiliated with Religious Orders or Communities. In fact, of the 33 priests who currently serve in our Diocese, 29 are Diocesan and only 4 belong to a Religious Community.

Patron of Parish Priests Diocesan Priests do not have a founder but we do have a Patron Saint. He is probably less known in Canada than in Europe but his name is St. John Vianney and his feast-day is celebrated next week, on Tuesday, August 4th.

Why No Founder?
Religious Orders like the Jesuits or the Franciscans were founded by individuals who felt called to minister to or

fulfill a specific need in the Church at that time. Those who felt called to to serve that need as priests and, in some Communities as, sisters or brothers joined and continue to join that particular Order to this

day. Instead, Diocesan Priests are those who feel called to serve the general Parish needs of the people in a particular Diocese, under the leadership of their Diocesan Bishop.

John Vianney: A Brief Bio Our Diocesan Priests' Patron is better known throughout the world as, *"the Curé (Pastor) of Ars"*. He was born near Lyons, France in 1786, just three years before the beginning of the French Revolution. Thankfully, his parents were devout Catholics who, despite the anticlerical senti-

ments of m a n y , ensured that John received his Sacraments. Despite m a n y d r a w -

backs, John was eventually ordained a Diocesan Priest in 1815 and was appointed the Pastor of the Parish of Ars, a village of only 230 people. He served there faithfully until his death, 41 years later. John showed such zeal and commitment as the Pastor of Ars that, when he died in 1859, he was renowned throughout the world as one of the most dedicated Pastors of all time!
