

Q. Which is the largest Religious Order of Priests and Brothers in the world today?


A. As of 2018, the Society of Jesus numbered 15,842 Jesuits serving in 112 nations on 6 continents, making it the largest single

Community of priests and brothers throughout the world. Their Founder's Day is July 31. In 1491, one year before Columbus set sail for the New World, the founder of the Jesuits, Ignatius of Loyola, was born in what is now Spain. He was a nobleman and a soldier, dedicated to the service of the then Spanish King and Queen, Ferdinand and Isabella.

At the age of 30, he was injured in battle and, while recuperating, happened to read a volume on the lives of the Saints, a book that changed his life forever! After reflecting on the lives of these heroes of the Faith, he committed himself to continue their work for Christ.

He began by enrolling in University courses at the age of 34 and before long he had acquired a group of like-minded friends and disciples around him at the University of Paris. The small group wanted to enact a commitment ceremony

in 1534, binding themselves to each other with vows of poverty and chastity. Three years later all were ordained to the priesthood.




Pope Paul III. This group of fervent young priests travelled to Rome to offer their priestly ministry directly to the Pope. They offered to teach the Catholic Faith

in the universities of Europe and to preach the Gospel to the peoples of the New World. Pope Paul III accepted their offer and, in 1540, the new *Society of Jesus* was established.

- ◆ Jesuits carried the Gospel to North America in 1622 and to Northwestern Ontario in 1667;
- ◆ Jesuit Father, Ludger Arpin became our first Pastor after founding this Parish of St. Patrick in 1893. He also established our first Catholic High School, Arpin Memorial (now, St. Patrick's).
- ◆ Pope Francis is our first Jesuit Pope in history, elected in 2013.
