CORRECT ANSWERS

1. c. We used to say this word at Mass three times in Latin: "Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus".

2. a. Baptism made you a sanctified or holy follower of Christ.

3. d. These two processes take several years to complete after one's death. The processes examine one's life for heroic Christian virtues

4. c. St. Joseph was named Patron in 1624 and St. Ann (*called the "Grandmother of the Faith" by the Indigenous Peoples*) in 1658.

5. a. The Basilica in Washington, D.C. is named "Immaculate Conception" to honour her.

6. b. Br. André was declared a Saint in 2010.

7. b. The "X" shaped cross which represents St. Andrew is part of the flags of Scotland and Nova Scotia (*New Scotland*) for this reason.

8. d. a: Italy, b: Holland; c: Canada & USA

9. d. When she was baptized, she was given the other name, "Catherine" or "Kateri".

10. a. Sts. Marguerite d'Youville & Bro. André of Montreal. (*3 born in France & 1 in U.S.A.*)

11. a. The Basilica in Budapest is named after Saint Stephen, King of Hungary (1083).

12. b. Named O. L. of the Cape because it is located in "Cap-de-la-Madeleine", a former city now part of Trois-Rivières, Québec
