



YOU WERE ASKING . . . by Msgr. P. Stilla

Q. Is it true that the names of the months of the year and the days of the week are derived from the names of pagan gods?

A. Yes, most of them are. One notable exception, at least in countries where languages derived from Latin are spoken, is the name for *Sunday*. In English, the name of the first day of the week obviously comes from the pagan worship of the sun,

(*Sunday*=*'day of the Sun'*). Instead, in the Latin derived languages, this day is known as the 'Lord's Day', to reflect the peoples' Christian belief. 'Dominus Vobiscum' Those who remember phrases from the old Latin Mass will recall that this familiar greeting means, 'the Lord be with you'. Using a variation of 'Dominus' ('the Lord'), Latin languages call the 1st day 'Day of the Lord': i.e. (Fr.)- 'Dimanche' (It.)-, 'Domenica'



or (Port. and Sp.), 'Domingo'. Pagan Gods, Emperors, & Others As I mentioned above, in western cultures we have used the names of pagan gods, celestial bodies and Emperors to designate the weekdays and months. In English we have even added to these, the names of Anglo-Saxon and Nordic gods. How were the names derived?

January: named after 'Janis', the Roman god of gates & doorways. *February*: from, 'Februa', (*the feast of purification*); *March*: named for 'Mars', the Roman god of war; *April*: from, 'Aphrillis' (Venus), the goddess of love; *May*: for, 'Maia', the goddess of Spring; *June*: for, 'Juno', the goddess of marriage; *July & August*: named to honour *the Caesars*: *Julius (July) & Augustus (August)*; *September, October, November, December*: these names mean:, 7th, 8th, 9th & 10th, indicating their numerical order until 46 AD, the year they inserted, July and August. Weekdays *Sunday*: 'sun's day'; *Monday*: 'moon-day'; *Tuesday*: Latin: 'Mar's day' but, in English, day of the pagan Nordic god, 'Tiw'; *Wednesday*: Latin: named for the god, 'Mercury'. In English, named for the Anglo-Saxon god, 'Woden'; *Thursday*: Latin: named for the Roman god 'Jove', (*Jupiter*). The English renamed it for their god, 'Thor'; *Friday*: Latin: day of 'Venus' or, in English, of the goddess, 'Freya' *Saturday*: day of the god, 'Saturn'.
