| <p><b>1. c.</b> This is why the canonization process takes so long after one's death (often many years).</p> <p><b>2. a.</b> To be canonized a Saint, one must first be beatified by the Church and named, "Blessed".</p> <p><b>3. d.</b> This person argues that the one who has been considered for canonization was not holy enough in life to be named a Saint.</p> <p><b>4. a.</b> Six are canonized "Saints" and twelve are beatified, "Blesseds".</p> <p><b>5. c.</b> As of 2020, St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the only layperson among the 18 Canadian Saints and Blesseds to be canonized a Saint.</p> <p><b>6. a.</b> The University in Québec City, which he originally founded, bears his name: "Laval".</p> | <p><b>7. d.</b> "Lily" is the flower in Christian art that represents chastity and purity. St. Kateri, who was Mohawk, remained chaste all her life.</p> <p><b>8. c.</b> They were maliciously nicknamed "Grey Nuns" because they helped the poor in the streets of Montreal who were "grey" (dirty).</p> <p><b>9. b.</b> Blessed Nakita Budka was the Ukrainian Catholic Bishop who blessed the Church of the Transfiguration in 1918 in our City's 'East End'.</p> <p><b>10. b.</b> He was not accepted to join the Order at first "because of poor health". He died at age, 91, outliving those who had rejected him!</p> <p><b>11. a.</b> It's never too late to answer God's call!</p> <p><b>12. c.</b> The Shrine's Church is named, St. Joseph.</p> |
