

Hand-made cards were delivered to senior members for

Valentine's Day with a chocolate heart, and on St Patrick's Day

with a peppermint, and at Easter with a chocolate egg.

St. Alphonsus, Wooler - During the month of November all the deceased members of St.



Alphonsus CWL were remembered, as well as those intentions of our parishioners. The book of life was placed on a table and all the intentions of parishioners were placed in a basket. The name of each deceased member was

The event was attended by 27 people from Catholic, United, Presbyterian, Salvation Army and Lutheran denominations and participants from North York to Montreal. 


The Divine Mercy Message and Devotion

The Second Sunday of Easter is known as <u>Divine Mercy</u> Sunday. The novena begins on Good Friday, April 2nd and ends on April 11th.

The Divine Mercy message and devotion is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

- **A** Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- **B** Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- ${\bf C}$ Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that all the graces of His mercy can only be received by our trust. The more we open the door of our hearts and live with Him with trust, the more we can receive.



RESOLUTIONS




