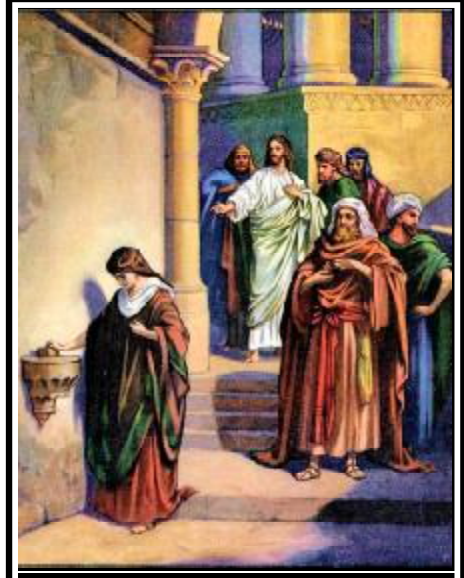

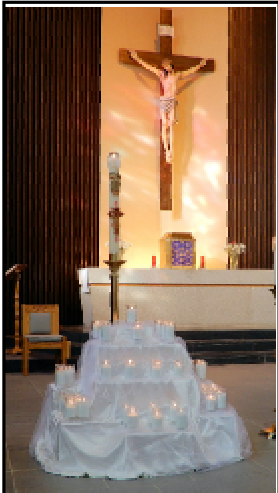

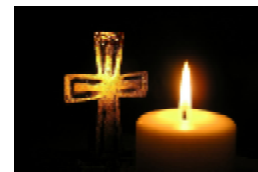
**REMEMBERING OUR PARISHIONERS AND

Q. My husband is seriously ill and close to death. Throughout our happy marriage together he continued to be a practising member of the Anglican Church and I have continued to practice my Catholic Faith. After his death, will it be possible to arrange for a Funeral Mass for him in the Catholic Church?

A. I am very sorry to hear about your husband's serious illness. I know that preparing for the funeral of a loved one when death is imminent is often a helpful but always one of the most difficult things to do. I pray that God's Spirit may guide you through this difficult time.

Option 1

Our parishioners should be aware that Catholic Funeral Masses in the Church are not reserved solely for deceased Catholics. In marriages of mixed Faiths like yours, the decision to have a Mass celebrated for the funeral of a non-Catholic spouse is entirely up to your family.

Option 2

A second option that could also be available for your husband Funeral is a Catholic Service of the Word without Mass, celebrated in the Church or in a Funeral Chapel.

Respect for Your Husband's Wishes

Although a Catholic Funeral Mass or Service are possible options, they may not be the best choices in your case. Since he has been a practising

member of the Anglican Church all his life, your husband may wish that, when the time comes, his Funeral should be celebrated in his own Church with the Anglican and not the Catholic priest officiating. If this is the case, I am sure that you would respect his final wishes and make

the appropriate arrangements with his Church. Of course, if both of you would still wish, your own Catholic pastor to take part in the Funeral alongside the Anglican priest, he can certainly do so, with the priest's consent.

Respecting Your Husband's Family

When choosing a Catholic Funeral Mass/Service for the deceased of other Faiths, one should also consider the feelings and comfort level of the bereaved family members, especially those who might find a Catholic Mass/Ceremony troubling or confusing. Perhaps in these instances your husband's Funeral should be celebrated in his Anglican Church and not in your Parish.

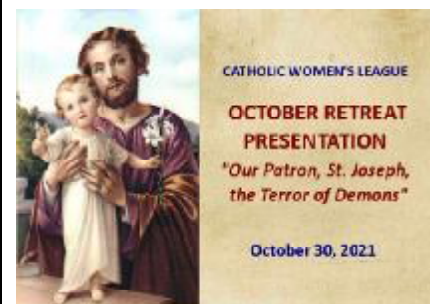
