Q. Why is Mary sometimes called, 'Our Lady of Mount Carmel'?

A. Mary was first given this title many centuries ago by the Religious Order called 'Carmelites', who venerate her as their Patroness. Under this title, Mary is depicted wearing the distinctive habit of the Carmelites; a brown tunic and monastic scapular and a beige mantle. The Christ child in her arms and Mary herself are depicted offering a scapular to us to wear as well.

The "Scapular" of the Carmelites

The Scapular worn as part of the religious habit of the Carmelite Order is a full body length rectangular cloth. However, the *commemorative scapular* worn around the neck by many, is a cloth necklace made of two small rectangular pieces of brown wool and bound together by a ribbon. In Parishes, children are given this scapular for First Communion.

re-establish itself elsewhere in Europe, where it quickly grew.

A Gradual Change

As the Order expanded, it evolved from a monastic community of contemplative prayer to an Order, called to minister to peoples' needs. Many, however, longed to return to their solitary monastic roots and so, in the 16th century, Sts. Teresa of Avila and John of the Cross and their followers, separated from this

original group, to form a new Order committed to its original way of life. They named this new group, 'Discalced Carmelites'.

Our Secular Order

Today, lay Catholics are welcome to form new secular groups who wish to follow a Carmelite spirituality. Our Diocese boasts one such 'Discalced' secular group of women and men. It is 'a community

dedicated to prayer and contemplation as expressed through the Teresian Carmelite way of Life'.

Brief History of Our Lady's Statue

The image venerated in our Cathedral comes from the old St. Dominic's Church (East End). It was later given to a Mrs. Forte and then to us, when she passed away. Then, Mrs. Angelina D'Uva donated a sum of money to have the statue restored. Our Lady of Mount Carmel is celebrated on July 16th.

The Religious Order of Carmel

Mount Carmel is in modern-day Israel. It was in this place that a group of hermits built a small chapel dedicated to Mary in the 12th century and gathered together a small community of persons who wished to dedicate themselves to solitude and contemplation. In 1226, the group received official recognition from the Church. Due to unrest in this part of the world, the new Order was forced to leave this original site in 1238 and
