Douglas McClure will be ordained to the Diocesan Priesthood by Bishop Colli next Saturday, January 28th at 2:00 pm. Doug was an ordained Anglican priest who, together with his wife, Lesley joined our R.C.I.A. and both were received as full members of the Catholic Church in 2016. Shortly after that, Doug asked if he could one day serve our people as a Catholic Priest. Once permission was granted by the Vatican to do so, he began his three year theological preparation here and, when the Decree of Admission was sent to our Diocese, Bishop Colli called him to Holy Orders. This explanation will help you appreciate the significance of this Rite.



After the Gospel is proclaimed, the ceremony proceeds as follows:

.. The Calling of the Candidate
One is called by God to the priesthood in the intimacy of his heart. This *internal* call is revealed as the Rite begins, when the candidate is publicly called by name.

.. The Petition & The Affirmation
After the candidate comes forward, the priest who was responsible for his training asks the Bishop to acknowledge this man's personal call in the name of the Church and to ordain him to the *Priesthood (Presbyterate)*. Then, he also testifies to the candidate's readiness and suitability for Ordination in the Catholic Church.

.. Acceptance by Bishop & People
The Bishop publicly expresses his acceptance to ordain this man and the Assembly shows its approval and support by applause.

.. Instruction & Commitment
Addressing the people and the candidate, the Bishop then gives an instruction on the priesthood and lists a priest's responsibilities in the Catholic Church. He then asks the candidate to publicly commit himself to fulfill these responsibilities.

.. The Promise of Obedience
Diocesan priests are ordained to serve the people of a Diocese in union with and under the direction of their Bishop. Therefore, the candidate must promise obedience and respect to his Bishop and to the Bishop's successors.

.. Prostration: An Act of Humility
While the candidate prostrates himself in prayer before the altar, the Litany of the Saints is chanted to implore the blessings of God and the help of all the Saints.

.. The Ordination
By the 'laying on of hands' on the candidate's head by the Bishop and the consecration prayer, Holy Orders is received. Then, to show the unity of the priesthood, the priests present also lay their hands on the head of the new priest.

.. Investiture, Anointing & Gifts
To celebrate the Eucharist is the priest's first privilege. He is therefore vested for Mass with stole and chasuble, his hands are anointed with Chrism and, bread and wine in a chalice are also presented to him.

.. The Sign of Peace
This greeting ends the Ordination Rite and Mass continues as usual.
